## Dollars to donuts: The great State Fair returns

We park the van, help the kids set up 4-H exhibits and make a beeline to the donut stand. Through the glass display in the mobile food trailer at the Illinois State Fair, we watch a machine pump out mini rings of donut batter into what resembles a lazy river of hot cooking oil. The donuts sizzle as they move along the channel of oil before a turner flips them to fry the opposite side. A worker coats the donuts in granulated sugar and serves them in quantities as large as commemorative plastic pails.

We own two and bring them to every

Illinois State Fair for bargain fill-ups.

The mini donuts, the pork burgers and a towering cup of soft-serve ice cream from the Dairy Building will feel extra special this August, which marks two years since the fair's return in Springfield. We're ready. We haven't seen enough food on sticks nor a life-sized cow carved from butter in 730 days.

During a typical visit, we entertain ourselves with experiences related to agriculture and natural resources. Our family watches a bit of the hog show and browses displays of fruits and gladioli stems with prize-winning rosettes. We take in a draft horse competition while sipping a lemon shakeup and wishing Illinois were less humid. Despite the August heat, educational exhibits and political parties set up camp.

Landscapes of blooming flowers beautify the 366-acre fairgrounds, ample space that allows residents to break from the norm. Visitors can view the birth of piglets or shoot a bow and arrow under supervision, all at the Illinois State Fair.

Modern farm machinery lines the street leading to the Commodities Pavilion, our family's favorite lunch space for Illinois-raised pork, beef and lamb. At some point, we venture over to Conservation World where the kids view tanks of local fish species and learn about the mussels they find in the river that borders the farm. A tractor-pulled tram takes us back to where we started, ready to collect the kids' 4-H exhibits and ribbons.

We depart with tired feet, full bellies and family memories without even experiencing the grandstand events, carnival rides nor twilight parade that kicks off the 11-day event. My heart sings a bit of the soundtrack from "State Fair," an old musical with good advice. "Don't miss it; don't even be late," or the donut line will be long.

# **Bustos to Deliver Wiswell-Robeson Lecture**

MONMOUTH, Ill. – U.S. Rep. Cheri Bustos of Illinois will deliver this year's Monmouth College Wiswell-Robeson Lecture on Sept. 7.

The fifth-annual lecture, which is focused on issues in agriculture, will be held at 7 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 7, in the College's Dahl Chapel and Auditorium. It is free and open to the public.

Bustos, a Democrat from Moline, has

represented Illinois' 17th Congressional District, which includes Knox and Warren counties, since 2013. A former journalist and healthcare executive, Bustos' assignments in Washington include serving as a member of the House Agriculture Committee.

The Wiswell-Robeson Lecture was founded in 2016 through a gift from 1960 Monmouth graduate Jeanne Gittings Robeson of Monmouth. The lecture's purpose is to annually feature a speaker from the agriculture community who explores issues, challenges and innovations in the industry.

Robeson and her late husband, Don Robeson, who was a 1954 Monmouth graduate, operated their farm in Warren County.

# Getting To Know Your Farm Bureau Policy

101. FARM EQUIPMENT

We support:

- 1. Clarifying and simplifying the vehicle code and regulations relating to farm vehicles.
- 2. Proper use of the slow moving vehicle (SMV) emblems, retailers providing information regarding proper use and law enforcement agencies enforcing proper use of SMVs.
- 3. Seeking legislation to increase the fine for the misuse of SMV emblems to at least \$75.00 for the first offense.
- 4. State and county Farm Bureaus developing an SMV and lighting campaign to encourage farmers to update their older

equipment with new amber flashing lights and SMV emblems.

- 5. Development and utilization of standardized specifications for pesticide containers and equipment connectors for closed pesticide application systems.
- 6. Farm equipment manufacturers and American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers (ASABE) working together to create an improved system for new equipment that would better indicate turns, such as sequentially-flashing red arrows, making them more noticeable for vehicles that are approaching or following.
- 7. Development and utilization of standardized wire color/function for any trailer licensed for over-the-road use or any towed implement of husbandry.
- 8. A farm equipment owner's right to maintain, service, repair, and rebuild their vehicle or farming equipment on their own accord or by the repair shop of their choice.

We oppose:

- 1. Licensing farm tractors and other implements of husbandry.
- 2. Mandatory retrofitting of lighting on farm equipment beyond that which was required by law as of 2018.

Take special measures to keep your backyard swing set safe for children by regularly maintaining the equipment. Check for rusted or protruding bolts, cracked swings and slides, broken ropes and open hooks.

Playgrounds should be installed on soft surfaces, like rubber mulch or tiles, to help insulate falls and prevent injury.






Community Health Centers are not just healers, we are innovators who look beyond medical charts to address the factors that may cause poor health, such as poverty, home-




