Hunter Safety Course Scheduled for June 26th & 27th

Area residents, 8 years old and above, will have an opportunity to learn basic principles of safe hunting at a Department of Natural Resources hunter safety course sponsored by the Knox County Farm Bureau Young Farmers. This course is scheduled to be held at the Knox Agri Center, 180 S. Soangetaha Rd, Galesburg, on Friday, June 26th from 5:30-9:00 pm and Saturday, June 27th from 8:00 am-3:00 pm. A snack will be provided on Friday evening and lunch provided on Saturday.

Participants must be 8 years old and above. A 1996 state law requires that all hunters born on or after January 1, 1980 must successfully complete the hunter

education course before they can receive their first hunting license. Participants completing the hunter education course will receive a Hunter Education Certification card verifying that they have passed the course of instruction.

The minimum ten hour course includes instruction in wildlife management, firearms safety, hunter ethics, game identification, first aid, survival techniques and regulations. You must pre-register by visiting knoxcfb.org or by calling the Knox County Farm Bureau office at 309-342-2036. This course is limited to 50 participants and will be filled on a first come first served basis.



Fast fix-its keep the farm going

Our 7-year-old son emerged from his room wearing a "farm play" shirt in preparation for school. I advised that this old Chicago Bears jersey had lost eligibility in the "good" category of clothing when one of its loose-fitting sleeves completely split from elbow to armpit.

A short conversation ensued. I didn't have time to sew. My husband, who stayed home longer than usual on that soggy spring morning, intervened and stapled the sleeve together. Three

"precisely placed" staples from my husband's college, Swingline stapler fixed the problem.

Call it some fodder for first grade showand-tell.

For good reason, our family farm shop keeps duct tape on hand in red, black, grey and white colors. And it's not to make a prom dress, an occasional teen inspiration readily viewed via a Google search. Farmers forever have found novel methods to fix things in enough ways to warrant books on the topic – and sometimes transform the industry.

Even a man named John Deere used a discarded saw blade to make his plow work better in Midwestern soils. His self-scouring plow helped found one of agriculture's greatest companies and unveil this breadbasket of the world.

An odd fix will work if it safely gets the job done, whether temporarily or permanently. Hog nose rings have held the soles on my dad's work shoes. A black-handled screwdriver consistently keeps one of the farm's hydrants from leaking between uses. A motorcycle strap for a time held the tailgate in place on "Green," a since-retired farm truck.

My husband learned to disassemble

a click-top, stick pen and use its hollow, round barrel to stiffen a spring to engage an implement switch. It confused me, too, but the moral of the story is that a 40-cent ink pen ensures \$300-per-bag seed corn goes in the ground.

Wire, tape and zip ties rank nearly as handy as pliers and crescent wrenches. Random bolts, nails or pieces of wire sometimes keep equipment going in the field until a replacement pin arrives. Baling twine from open bales deserves keeping, maybe for a make-shift belt or the medium to hang the chicken feeder.

Log chains and chain binders recently helped limp a planter back home for repair. Rubber tarp straps hold implement hoses in place and out of trouble, particularly if a support breaks. J-B Weld makes a reliable mend and WD-40 mums squeaky problems.

Farmers expressed a do-it-yourself mentality long before the DIY acronym moved mainstream. Farm magazines for years have featured tips and innovative ideas from the farm. Although, we have yet to see the pen trick make the news.

Illinois Farm Families' City Moms Tour Monsanto

In April, Illinois Farm Families volunteers, Paul and Donna Jeschke, gave a presentation about GMOs at the Illinois Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics meeting in Óak Brook. Approximately 300 dieticians and nutritionists attended the meeting.

Also last month, Illinois Farm Families celebrated Earth Day through its social media channels. Original photo posts were created and ultimately reached a total audience of 62,700.

To top it off, 22 Illinois Farm Families' City Moms alumnae toured Monsanto's Biotechnology Research Center in St. Louis, Mo. The moms were accompanied by Illinois farmers, Katie Pratt, Deb Moore and Chad and Stacy Schutz.

The Moms had the opportunity to talk to Monsanto representatives during group tours, lunch and a panel discussion.

Outcomes from the tour include:

•Prior to the tour, 50 percent of the City Mom alumnae were somewhat or very concerned about GMOs and biotechnology. After the tour, 85.7 percent were not at all or not very concerned.

•Prior to the tour, 76.2 percent felt somewhat or very knowledgeable about human safety of GMO seeds and crops. After the tour, 100 percent felt somewhat or very knowledgeable.

•Prior to the tour, 57.2 percent felt somewhat or very knowledgeable about the environmental impact of GMOs. After the tour, 90.5 percent felt somewhat or very knowledgeable.







No Time to See the Doctor?

June is Men's Health Month. The goal of Men's Health Month is to heighten the awareness of preventable health problems and encourage detection and treatment of disease among men and boys.

Are you a guy who waits until something is seriously wrong before going to the doctor? You're not alone. Top five reasons men don't go to the doctor:

- 1) I feel FINE. We are glad you feel fine, but you can feel FINE with high cholesterol, high blood pressure and elevated blood sugars.
- 2) Going to the doctor is a girl thing. Many of you feel this way but remember on average, men die almost 6 years younger than women.
- **3) I don't have time.** Of course you don't have time. You have 18 holes of golf to play, fields to work in, animals to take care of and ball games to go to. Look, we're all busy, but making time for a doctor visit once a year isn't a big deal.
- 4) You don't realize we are here for prevention. You don't have to be sick to go see a doctor and if you establish a relationship with one you have easy access when you do get sick. Once a year you can touch base with them to discuss age appropriate screening which we KNOW helps you stay well.

5) You don't have a relationship with a physician. If you are not attached to a regular physician by the age of 40 you are more likely to get in trouble. Unlike women who need annual pap smears, you haven't had to see someone regularly from the age of 18-30. Find someone your friends use or call the Knox County Community Health Center at 309-344-2225 for an appointment.

Men of all ages need regular testing of blood pressure and cholesterol to identify heart disease risk. Beginning around age 40, men should being screening for diabetes. Then starting at age 50, screening for colorectal cancer and prostate should begin.

From the Knox Community Health Clinic to you, taking care of your family is what it is all about. If you don't take the time to take care of your body, you won't be able to adequately provide for those you love and carry out your manly responsibilities. Be happy, be healthy and live a long life. 


