**Farm Provides
a Gathering Ground**

My Spiritual Gifts Quiz from church put hospitality at the top of my list. Mom didn't take the quiz, but I'll bet the Lievens 40 she'd score the same. So, with a strong service mindset and the shop space to match, we host. In the last 10 years, our farm has hosted two weddings, FFA and 4-H meetings, farmer events, a bridal shower, my daughter's graduation party, and last summer, the first-ever all-class reunion for our local high school.

By now, our employees know "other duties as assigned" in their job descriptions gets some mileage. And they know with Christmas coming, the shop clear-out and clean-up is imminent. In prepa-

ration for our four-generation Christmas party, we pause machinery maintenance, remove the farm equipment and scrub the concrete floor. Christmas carols replace country tunes on the shop speakers. When the big event arrives, the cousins make memories in a farm shop turned makeshift gymnasium for kicking balls, shooting hoops and riding pedal tractors. The adults play cards in the conference room, and potluck food lines tables down the office hallway for mealtime and grazing.

The farm naturally brings together family, tradition and community at the intersection of work and home, hospitality and hard work, generosity and gravel. Yes, rocks. We farm with 21st-century equipment and still live on a 20th-century road - a nuisance for guests arriving in heavy rain (mud and washouts), a dry spell (fog-level dust) or the early spring thaw when your car wrestles with the gravel road. It's all part of the experience.

Mom ensures hospitable elements carry farm flair. From wood salvaged off an old barn, a local carpenter transformed an old chest freezer into a rustic drink and ice cream station and fashioned a rolling bar to match. A "dessert wagon" sports steel wheels from an old loading chute and the door from a barn mow hides some of the welding corner. Among my favorites: Two tractors on the farm span exactly 70 years apart to make a conversation piece as much as a party backdrop.

The FFA mom in me roots for a winter "drive-in movie" with teen vehicles parked in the shop to watch a film on the drywall projector screen. But if not, we'll have a farm conference in March and a graduation party in May. Fingers crossed, the weather allows planting in April.

Health on the Farm

By the Knox County Health Department

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program

The holidays are right around the corner, and our WIC office at the Knox County Health Department is here to offer you support through this busy season.

The WIC program offers nutrition education, breastfeeding support, and access to healthy foods for pregnant and postpartum women, as well as children up to the age of 5. Our staff work closely with families to assess their nutritional needs, connect them with resources, and ensure they receive the support necessary for healthy growth and development. "If times have changed for you and you could use a little extra help, then please stop at the WIC office to verify your eligibility to see if we can help you or your family. We are here to help lessen the struggle," states Stacy Bainter, the Director of Family Health at the Knox County Health Department.

The WIC food packages provide supplemental foods designed to address the specific nutritional needs of participants. Whether you are pregnant, breastfeeding, or postpartum, WIC has a food package tailored for you. Packages also differ between infants and children aged 1 to 5 years old,

to offer the best nutrition for their stage of growth. To make grocery shopping easier, WIC has launched the Illinois Interactive Food Guide. This online tool can help you quickly identify which foods and brands are WIC-approved, so there is no guesswork at the grocery store. The guide can be accessed at IllinoisWICFoods.org.

Along with the normal benefits, WIC participants are issued Farmer's Market coupons every summer. These coupons can be used to buy fresh fruits and vegetables from farmers markets or roadside stands starting in July until the end of October.

If you need breastfeeding guidance, look no further. Michelle Rickard, our Certified Lactation Counselor (CLC), is here to provide support for you and your baby to achieve your breastfeeding goals. She can assist you in prenatal breastfeeding education, positioning and latching, breastmilk storage, and handling, and how to overcome common breastfeeding challenges.

Knox County Agriculture in the Classroom Update

As the holidays approach, Mrs. Green has been teaching kindergarten and first grade students about reindeer. Fortunately for Knox County, we have a reindeer farm for students to visit if they want to see a REAL reindeer.

Prairie Moon Farms in Knoxville has helped to educate coordinators about reindeer. This year they were so gracious and allowed AITC to borrow a REAL reindeer antler! Students were amazed at the size of the antler, and they compared it to two different white-tailed deer antlers brought to class. They also compared the size and shape of horns to antlers. While reindeer and white-tailed deer look a lot alike, they also have a connection to cows.

Male reindeer are called bulls



and female reindeer are called cows, making their babies a calf! Students enjoyed the up-close experience of learning about antlers.

Mrs. Hennenfent has been teaching the third, fourth and fifth graders about turkeys for the month of November. Her focus is on turkey production. Female hens lay the eggs which hatch in 28 days. The baby poults are delivered to farmers on heated semi-trucks within 24 hours. The poults start in brooding barns with warmer temperatures and high protein food. After five weeks, they move to finishing buildings.

Female hens and male toms are separated when they hatch and kept in different buildings. Females are processed as whole birds in four months and toms are processed into sliced deli meats, bacon and sausage at five months.

So, your Thanksgiving turkey is a hen and Subway sandwich is from toms! Mrs. Hennenfent also brought in wild turkey tail feathers so the students could see the difference between wild and farm turkey feathers. We learned their other distinguishing characteristics, too. Our goal is always to teach students better understanding and appreciation for the foods they eat!

Recipe of the Month

Andes Mint Cookies

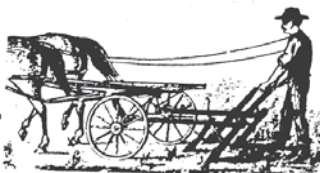
Ingredients:

- 1 box chocolate cake mix
- 1 cup Andes mint baking chips
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 2 eggs
- 20 Andes mint chocolates

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 350°F and line a cookie sheet with parchment paper or silicone baking mat.
2. Combine cake mix, eggs, and oil and mix until dough forms.
3. Stir in Andes mint pieces.
4. Portion out balls of dough that are 1 1/2 inch to 2 inches in size.
5. Place cookie balls on baking sheet, about 2-3" apart.
6. Bake at 350 for 8-10 minutes, until cookies puff up and cracks form in the surface.
7. Remove from oven and immediately place one unwrapped Andes chocolate mint on top of each cookie.
8. Wait a couple minutes so that the hot cookies start to melt the chocolates. Use an offset spatula or butter knife to spread the chocolate on top of the cookies.
9. Allow cookies to cool, so chocolate sets.
