

Fun with Resources on the Farm

We can hike the woods, kayak the river, hop hay bales and fish for hours. But top on their list for farm fun? Digging a hole.

When my cousins' kids visit the farm, the No. 1 request is to find "Farmer Doug" who will stabilize his backhoe in a harmless, remote space on the farm. My dad acts as a driver's education instructor as they use the bucket with hydraulic thumb to dig, dump and even grab a tire and smash an old piece of metal that he staged in their big kid sandbox. Oh, the delight in digging.

No matter the dwelling, we hold the power to make our own fun where we reside. Certainly, the farm has plenty of natural and man-made resources to amplify the options. My teenage son takes his friends tent camping beyond the Southeast Field. They play Airsoft in the Moody Timber. He buckles up in a utility vehicle to ride trails with cousins, and the farmstead provides some challenging games of hide and seek.

Straw in the barn satisfies the climbers and outdoor rows of round bales the jumpers. We hunt for deer, raccoons and morel mushrooms in the appropriate season. The snowmobile and sleds surface when the snowfall exceeds 2 inches. My daughter finds peace for homework and reflections on the farm near the river bridge, and in the warm months, she frequently picks wild-flowers in ditches and woodland areas.

On a slow-paced day, we sit on the porch smelling the smoker transform our

farm-raised beef chuck roast into the most flavorful pulled beef and question why anyone besides neighbors would want to drive our dusty gravel road. Then again, we realize our routine farm chores deliver someone else's fun. Relatives who visit love to feed the cattle, so Dad makes piles of grain around the utility vehicle for an up-close encounter. They gather eggs from our chicken house, harvest vegetables from Mom's garden and ride in the combine and tractors in the fall or the planters in the spring while we work.

We take vacations away from the farm and immensely enjoy them, but it never crosses my mind to make travel plans on a Labor Day break or other long weekends. Rather, those extended days provide the gift of time to enjoy being at home and on the farm.

Getting To Know Your Farm Bureau Policy

103. FIREARM SAFETY

We support:

- 1. Active promotion of gun safety programs.
- 2. Repeal of the Firearms Owners Identification Act (FOID).
- 3. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act issuing permits to carry concealed firearms to qualified Illinois' citizens through an appropriate application process.
- 4. Current laws that requires background checks and waiting periods for handgun purchases.
 - 5. Legislation to allow active military per-

sonnel residing in Illinois the opportunity to obtain a concealed carry permit without regard to state of residence.

- 6. The opportunity for school districts to allow school personnel to voluntarily carry a concealed firearm while on duty and on school property.
- 7. An Illinois State Police endorsed certification/training program for school personnel who are approved by their school district to carry a concealed firearm on school property.
- 8. Statewide efforts to explore the use of less lethal weapons in addition to lethal weapons in schools and other government institu-

tions where children are usually present.

- 9. School districts engaging with law enforcement to provide active shooter training programs.
- 10. Timely processing of Concealed Carry License (CCL) permit applications and renewals that allow for completion within 60 days.
 - 11. The right to protect personal property.
- 12. Agritourism featuring hunting activities and hunter safety programs for adolescents and adults.

We oppose gun laws that would decrease the ability of law-abiding citizens to protect their property or themselves.

Farmers Donate 24,000 Lbs. of Milk To Food Banks

Recognizing the hardships many communities are facing, Illinois Milk Producers Association (IMPA) donated 24,000 pounds of milk, including lactose-free, between three local food banks.

"Many families continue to struggle with food insecurity amid high prices at the grocery store," said Don Mackinson, IMPA president. "Everyone deserves access to fresh, nutritious food, which is why Illinois dairy farmers have come together to once again donate milk to local food banks supporting our communities."

IMPA donated a combined 48,250 servings to River Bend Food Bank in Galesburg, Northern Illinois Food Bank in Geneva, Central Illinois Foodbank in Springfield and Eastern Illinois Foodbank in Urbana in celebration of June being National Dairy Month. The donation was made on June 16 in partnership with Prairie Farms, Illinois Farm Bureau, Illinois Corn Marketing Board (ICMB), Illinois Soybean Association (ISA), St. Louis District Dairy Council (SLDDC) and Midwest Dairy.



Tractor & Mower Safety Challenge



Make Your Back to School Physicals and Immunizations Appointments

time to start school before we know it. When you start making your back-toschool to-do lists, don't forget to add appointments for school physicals and immunizations. The Knox County Health Department and the Knox Community Health Center are here to provide you with a one stop shop for all immunization and physical requirements.

The Knox Community Health Center, located at 1361 W. Fremont St., Galesburg, offers school and sports physicals by appointment and on a walk-in basis Monday through Friday 7:00am-5:00pm. Families who do not have a primary care physician for their kids can get connected with providers at the Knox Community Health Center who can provide children with annual physicals. Call 309-344-2225 to schedule an appointment with one of our providers today.

The Knox County Health Department, located at 1361 W. Fremont St., Galesburg, offers all vaccinations needed to meet the Illinois School Immunization Requirements. If your child is behind on immunizations, our providers can help get them back on track. The Health Department accepts Medicaid, insurance, cash, check

Summer is flying by, and it will be and credit cards. KCHD also offers the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program, which provides free or low-cost vaccines to those eligible. Any child from birth to 18 can qualify if they are eligible for Medicaid, uninsured, underinsured, or American Indian or Alaskan Native.

> Childhood vaccinations are vital to protect both our children and the community from serious illnesses. Vaccines have been so effective in decreasing once common, life-threatening childhood infections that it's easy to forget how important it is to keep our children protected from those illnesses. The only reason we don't see diseases like childhood meningitis, measles, polio, and tetanus more often today is because many children are vaccinated.

> As families start compiling their back to school to do lists, the Knox County Health Department and Knox Community Health Center look to cross vaccinations and physicals off that list. We think it's important for parents to be aware of all the services public health and the health center have and how they can be your go to resource. Please contact the Knox County Health Department at 309-344-2224 or go to www.knoxcountyhealth.org for information about available vaccines and medical services.


by John Chandler and orange sticks to mark the spot, over a hundred new plants were put into the ground. The families will be invited back for the harvest.




